





Principles of Civil Aviation Legal Framework and Law of International Air Carriage

The aim of the training is to systematically introduce participants with little or no knowledge of aviation to the basics of civil aviation legal issues and, in particular, to the relevant legal framework, the relevant players in aviation legislation and some practical examples of liability law application. Participants will expand their knowledge and increase their acceptance in the field of work they are practising or aspiring to. The intensive training methods lead to a particularly good, sustainable consolidation of the newly acquired aviation knowledge.

The two-day intensive program is designed for employees, managers, project managers, consultants and postgraduate students who have made their way into the aviation industry or are striving to do so on a permanent or project-related basis. The training is also suitable for other participants with an interest in acquiring systematic basic knowledge of civil aviation legislation.
